

Arte Solidale Festival international classical music festival and charity, which takes place every year in the area of Lake Como, Italy. The mission of the Festival is both to promote young artists as well as to support minors in need, by collaborating with social organisations in the territory of Lake Como.

The concerts, set during springtime each year, take place in historical villas and palaces on the shores of Lake Como, where composers like Franz Liszt and Johannes Brahms used to spend time and compose, inspired by the amazing landscapes. Multiple themed concerts, including solo recitals, chamber music and orchestral music concerts, are presented to the audience. Every year the Festival presents events dedicated to families with children, as well.

Over its five editions, the Festival featured young soloists and orchestral musicians from Italy, Latvia, USA, Spain, France, Slovenia, Russia. The 2020 edition will feature the Arte Solidale Festival Orchestra, as well as the Crescendo Youth Orchestra, featuring children soloists, together with different chamber music ensembles. Concerts will take place in world-famous locations such as Villa Balbianello and Villa Carlotta in Tremezzina.

As per every year, the Festival will collect funds for minors in need, collaborating with local social organizations such as Coordinamento Comasco and Cooperativa Azalea (Tremezzina). All the artists and musicians involved in the Festival share the principle of supporting children as they deeply understand the need of a stable social environment during childhood.

Recognised as a valuable project, Arte Solidale Festival was awarded the Youth Bank Prize of Fondazione Comasca, and supported by the Lombardy Region.

What makes Arte Solidale Festival unique?

· Amazing venues

All of the Festival concerts take place in historical buildings and villas, with great views of the magical environment of Lake Como. Some venues are open to the public, and the audience has the possibility to visit them by attending the concert. Other venues are not open to the public, and the only occasion to visit them is during the events of the Festival.

· High quality concerts at a low price

The entrance to the events of the Festival is by donation, so the audience is able to listen to high quality musician at a relatively low price.

· Helping children

By making a donation at the events, the audience not only gets to attend a concert in a unique setting, but helps the activities of the collaborating charities and organizations, since that the proceeds are entirely collected towards helping minors in need.

The social impact of Arte Solidale Festival

Over the years the Festival helped local charities to create a stronger awareness of their activities in the area of Lake Como, and collected funds that enabled them to create different projects for children in need.

- In 2015 the project for children "Possiamo Farcela!" (We can make it!) was started thanks to the funds collected during the Festival.
- · In 2016 the funds financed 10 different projects for over 40 minors (music therapy, sport activities, horse-riding therapy)
- ·In 2017 over 60 minors and 4 caretakers/guardians were helped by the Festival with projects such as art therapy, music therapy, recreational activities and sport activities.
- The collections from 2018/2019 are still funding several sport- and music-related projects for over 60 minors.


